

# ADULT SUNDAY MORNING

**Study of Elijah** | Geoff Johnson | Room 217

*His name means "The LORD is my God." The message of his life matched his name. It still does today. Not only do we see evidence of this man threaded throughout portions of the Old Testament, but we also find mention of him sprinkled in the New Testament as well. His name? Elijah. So who was Elijah? What did he accomplish? As a person, what was he like? How did his faith intertwine with his everyday living? And how does he impact us? Let's take a look at a few attributes of Elijah and see how this man of faith encourages us in our own faith today.*

**The I AM Statements** | Mark Burroughs | Room 221

*During Jesus's ministry on earth, He said many things that challenged His listeners. In fact, He often spoke in parables, or, as we will see in this article, in metaphors. He used figurative language to relate common objects or concepts with Himself or His Kingdom so that people could better understand His character and purpose. In the book of John, there are seven times in which Jesus says "I am \_\_\_\_." Each statement gives us a glimpse into God's character and what He's like. One important point: it's imperative to read these "I am" statements in context so we form an accurate understanding of what Jesus was really saying.*

**Colossians for Beginners** | Bob Graham | Auditorium

*The church at Colossae was under attack from false teachers who were denigrating the deity of Jesus; they were teaching that He was not actually God. Though Paul had never been to the church itself, he addressed these issues head-on. The nature of Jesus Christ as Creator and Redeemer was nonnegotiable, so Paul wrote to them that he might bring his wisdom to bear on this difficult and trying situation. It was critical to him that this church know God in His greatness and glory, rather than in the deficient view given them by the false teachers.*

**New Christian Class** | Adam Wilson & Mark Sloan | Room 240 (Hispanic Classroom)

*So now that I am a Christian what's next? What do I need to learn to truly become a disciple of Jesus Christ? What do I need to know about the unique nature of the Lord's church? Why do we worship the way we do? These, and other questions, will be examined in this class which is designed for those who have recently been baptized or who have recently placed membership here at West End. The class will cover basics in the Bible that will help the student understand more about the Lord's church and how to live the Christian life.*

**Echoing His Heartbeat: The Life of David** | Room 204 (Ladies)
