EEM UPDATE

Thanks to congregations like ours, EEM's 2019 Million Dollar Sunday goal of 2.5 million has been met. Last year was a record-setting year for EEM with nearly 1.2 million Bibles and biblical materials printed and distributed. That would require over 10 miles of bookshelf space to hold all this literature. Distributed highlights include 100,000 Bibles for children in Croatia, over 20,000 Greek New Testaments in Thessaloniki, over 260,000 Bibles and biblical based materials in the Ukraine, plus expansions in Moldova and Poland. All of that is in addition to EEM's ongoing programs of providing God's Word to individuals, public schools, orphanages, churches, camps, and prisons in 30+ countries in over 20 languages.

EEM also produced their first printing of Macedonian Bibles, the Slovak New Testament, and Children's Bibles for Roma community. This year EEM's goal is 163 publishing projects representing both new books and reprints in various languages and titles. EEM has also planned new public school distribution in Croatia, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Hungary, Romania, Serbia, and Ukraine. Remember, **The Bible. We Want Everyone To Get It.**
